

Fingerprinting:

If the CRRP determines the combination of your gender and date-of-birth is shared by someone who has been charged with or convicted of a sexual offence, you will be asked to provide fingerprints to confirm your identity. In such circumstances, fingerprinting is required to eliminate the possibility that an offender has changed their name to avoid detection.

If your fingerprints are required, you will receive a letter directly from the CRRP containing a set of instructions. It is important that you attend to this requirement as soon as possible. Failure to do so means that you are not fully consenting to a CRC.

Note: At no time are fingerprints added to a database where they could be subject to search.
